What's that noise?

Hide objects that make a noise in a bag or under a jumper (e.g. keys, stones, twigs, leaves, phone, money).
Make one of the sounds. Can your child guess what it is?

Try some of these activities when you're waiting for a bus, at nan's house, having a picnic, in a waiting room...



Our very own story

Take turns to add a bit to a story. The first person says 'once upon a time there was...' etc. Try linking the story to the place where you are or the people you've seen.

Peek-a-boo

Use a coat/scarf/blanket and play peek-a-boo. Say 'boo' each time you, the child or a toy reappears. For older children, play hide and seek with them or a toy. Say things like 'ready steady, boo', 'here I am!', 'where are you?'



Describe it

Choose any object that you can see. Take turns to add a descriptive word to it.

*E.g. A ball – it's a **yellow** ball, it's **round**, it **bounces**, it's a **small** ball, it's a **soft** ball.*
